Van Drivers and Riders – Drive vans or help children into and out of safety seats, supervise, hold their hands, and walk with them into the center and to their homes. (Mornings, Lunch, Afternoon)

Child Enrichment Activities – Dance, read, lead crafts, or play games in childcare providers' settings.

Dress-up Clothes and Art Supplies Organizer

Relief Child Care Provider – for childcare providers to attend trainings. Experience and training required.

Business or Marketing Consultants – Assist providers with small business management, tax and financial record keeping and marketing. Relevant experience and training required. Flexible times.
